## Making a point!

On 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> February 2017, the partners consortium met in Cham (Germany) for the second meeting of the project. During the two days of work, the partners started with the analysis of the results and the recommendations of the Intellectual Output 1, that is developing a share methodology for evaluating competences acquired in informal and no-formal environment by NEETs, school-dropouts, young immigrants/refugees with a low education level (EQF1 and 2 - European Qualifications Framework). The final aim is to make their learning recognizable in order to support them to enter into the labor market.

## Activities



The IO1 results were surprising. Even though the partners' social and economic contexts are different, the research showed very similar trends: Employers think that the most important competence that youngsters have is the Digital Competence and the most required to get into the labor market is Communication in the mother tongue. The meeting was enriched by the opportunity to share the knowledge on Best Practices, already mentioned into the IO1 report, and experienced during the meeting thanks to the presence of the experts invited to join it.

Starting from these results, the partners keep on working with IO2. The approach will comprise of two main parts: 1) The development of a technical resource, based on a badges system, that will allow the young people to recognize and certify their competences acquired through non-formal and informal learning.

2) A handbook addressed to the stakeholders working with NEETs, school-dropouts, young immigrants/refugees on how to work with and to use the SHARE Methodology.



The activities of the Intellectual Output 2 are planned to be completed in November 2017.
